This half term's homework activities are centred around our history theme of 'the Stone Age'. The tasks have been chosen to ensure they are relevant, fun and allow the children to present their work in a format of their choosing. Children can bring in their work to show the class or take a photo if they wish.

The deadline for tasks is **Friday 17<sup>th</sup> December**, however, children are welcome to bring in any completed tasks before then. We encourage children to try and complete 2/3 tasks of their choosing. Thank you for your support!

Imagine you are an archaeologist. Place small objects in sand, soil or rice and ask someone to find them using a small brush (like a toothbrush or make up brush) or teaspoon. Ask someone to hide objects for you to find.	Create types of paint by crushing berries, grass, leaves and other natural materials. Use the paint to make a picture.	Use natural materials to create a picture of the Stone Age.
Imagine you can go back in time to the Stone Age. You can take one piece of modern technology.  What would you take and why?	Create a poster with your ten favourite Stone Age facts and present it to the class.	Draw a picture of what your cave would look like if you lived in the Stone Age.
Create an acrostic poem using the word 'Stone Age'.	People in the Stone Age used marks when they were counting. Can you count how many toys or books you have and use  tally marks to record this?	Create a Stone Age necklace or piece of jewellery using pasta. Paint the pieces of pasta using suitable colours for Stone Age period.
