This half term's homework activities are centred around our Geography topic of 'Natural Disasters'. The tasks have been chosen to ensure that they are relevant, fun and allow the children to present their work in a format of their choosing (often children relish the opportunity to create a Powerpoint presentation to present to the class!). The deadline for tasks is Monday 16th December; however, children are welcome to bring in any completed tasks before then. We encourage children to try and complete 3 tasks of their choosing. Create your own cross-section of the Earth, using any medium of your choice (playdough, cake) OR make a 3D model of a typical Roman building that you might find in Pompeii.	Build your own model volcano — can you make it erupt?!	Imagine that your home was destroyed in a natural disaster and you have to make a shelter to live in. Build your own den and take a photo as evidence!
Imagine that you witness a natural disaster; can you write a story, newspaper report or paragraph to describe what it was like?	Research and present findings in your own words on the 'The Ring of Fire'	Let's go fly a kite! Borrow, use your own or make a kite to fly. Choose a windy day and ask somebody to take a photo of yourself flying the kite (we can print these in school).
Research Ernest Shackleton's Endurance expedition. What does he teach us about aspirations? Present your findings in a method of your choosing.	Make a natural hazard themed playlist that could be played during lessons.	Create your own natural hazard board game with rules.
