Scavenger Hunt! Look around your home carefully and find 12 electrical appliances which have switches on them. Draw each appliance and write the name of the appliance beneath the picture.	Demonstrate the skills which you have learned in stitching and gathering material. Can you create something of your own to show to the class? Could your project have an important message linked to 'sustainability'?	Create your own version of a hydro dam or wind turbine — take photographs of your experiments at home.
Easter — using hard boiled eggs can you create a religious scene from Easter? For example: Moses parting the Red Sea, Jesus riding into Jerusalem at the beginning of Easter Week, the crucifixion, the resurrection of Jesus — be as creative as you like!!	Using the skills which you have gained during our PE lessons, create your own dance or gymnastics routine (you can do this with a partner if you like) to show during our PE lesson. OR — research warm up/cool down exercises so that you can run a warm up or cool down session in one of our PE lessons	Draw your own 'area robot' and work out it's area using your mathematical knowledge. Please see Mrs Gates if you require squared paper.
Create your own musical instrument — can you demonstrate pitch/pulse/melody using your musical instrument?	Create a family photo album, labelling each photograph in French (e.g. ma souer,mon frère).	Using figurative (metaphors and similes) and emotive language, write a poem about the damage being done to our planet by humans, urging people to act now to save our future!
