English	<p>Writing This week, we will be creating marvellous recipes for tasty Stone Age stew!</p> <p>Our writing process this week is...</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Looking closely at existing recipes and magpieing vocabulary and understanding their structure (imperative verbs).2. Understanding what prepositions are and writing sentences that also include a range of adverbs.3. Writing up a Stone Age stew recipe using devices, vocabulary and grammar discussed.4. Edit and improve.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I have uploaded a powerpoint recapping previous learning about Stone Age foods.• I have provided an existing recipe to use as a model example for your child to look through.• I have uploaded a PowerPoint to inform children about adverbs and prepositions.• Your child could replicate the model example of a Stone Age stew.• Once written, your child could attempt to make a stew for themselves, using their own recipe.
	<p>Reading At school, children will be participating in their group reading session, once a week. On days where they are not group reading, they will be answering comprehension questions from a text that they are given.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I have attached the reading comprehension sheet that your child/ren would have been accessing, had they been in school. The third page contains a set of questions that they can try and answer about the text.• Use the book that they have received from school and ask them questions from the question bank located at the back of the book.
