Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exploring numbers to 10 and beyond • Singing number songs • Representing numbers practically • Matching numerals to quantities correctly 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sing some of the number songs we sing at school • Count some minibeasts! Draw 10 minibeasts - you could try ladybirds or worms. See if you can count them all. Write the numbers 1-10 on some paper. Hide them

		<p>around your house and go on a hunt to find some minibeasts. Check you have them by placing them on the numbers and counting them with your grown up</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you play the number action game? Think of 5 different actions to do such as claps, jumps, crouching down etc and do each action 5 times • Go on a shape hunt around your house. See if you can find lots of items that are all square shaped. Collect some items and send me a photo on Tapestry of what you have found • Here is a link to some maths games you can play Early Years
Knowledge and Understanding /Creative	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talking about a minibeast life cycles • Learning the names of different minibeasts • Playing 'What am I?' games to guess which minibeasts we can see • Summer activities 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are thinking about foods that are healthy and unhealthy. Can you go around your kitchen and find some healthy and unhealthy foods and sort them into piles? Send me a photo of what you found • Sing some songs all about that we are singing at school all about minibeasts - I have added them onto Tapestry • Look on Tapestry for the 'What am I? Minibeast game for you to play • Please see Tapestry for summer based activities

Have different stations for certain activities such as star jumps, hops, jumps • Can you try these different movements for minibeasts?
