

Phonics / Reading - We follow the Read Write Inc phonics program. Children will continue to apply Set 1 Speed Sounds to reading and spelling and learn the remainder of Set 2 Speed Sounds. We will continue to build sight vocabulary of tricky 'red' words too.

Please keep an eye out for your child's little Speed Sounds book to keep track of the sounds that have been



Writing - Writing and spelling sessions will model how to use 'Fred Fingers' to spell phonetically regular words.

Children will be taught strategies to help them compose and record simple sentences, using capital letters, spaces and full stops. Some of these writing opportunities will include:

- New Year Hopes and Wishes
- Labelling seaside features
- Posters linked to recycling/littering


