

# The Stone Age Writing



The children will become familiar with a story, use knowledge and understanding to answer questions about the text, to use direct speech, use description and descriptive language, plan a similar story to the Stone Age Boy.

Cross curricular coverage with History – The First Drawing by Mordicai Gerstein. Character descriptions, diary entries and recounts.

 Splash by Claire Cashmore (aspirations).

## Art



Painting using a number of brush techniques, using thick and thin brushes to produce shape, textures, patterns and lines – link to cave paintings.  
 Collage – select and arrange materials for a striking effect.

## Music



Children will explore music across a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions including the works of great composers.

## RE



Christianity – God and Jesus.  
 Understanding of religions and world views. The children will learn about old testament stories links to British Values through tolerance of other people's beliefs.

## Maths

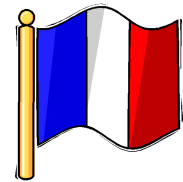


- Represent numbers to 100.

## History



Stone Age.  
 The children will learn about changes until the Iron Age to include the discovery of fire, hunters, gatherers and farmers.  
 How they lived, day to day life, and focuses on Stonehenge.
