Subject	In school learning	Remote learning
<b>Literacy/ Communication</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Our book this week is Farmer Duck</li> <li>• Listening games about farm animals</li> <li>• Settling back in to school</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Here is a link for you to watch Farmer Duck <a href="https://youtu.be/NzP1a1Z-i-g">https://youtu.be/NzP1a1Z-i-g</a></li> <li>• While listening to the story, join in with the repeated animal sounds</li> <li>• Once you have read the story, tell a grown up what your favourite part of the story was</li> <li>• Use the 'can you find it' poster to find the animals on the farm. Tell your grown up what noises they make</li> <li>• Sing some songs about animals on the farm</li> <li>• Get some small world animals and hide them under a basket. Ask a grown up to take an animal and see if you can guess which one has been taken away</li> </ul>
<b>Maths</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Singing songs with counting</li> <li>• Recapping on the past half term</li> <li>• Numbers 1-5</li> <li>• Ordering numerals</li> <li>• Knowledge of numbers</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sing songs about five little ducks</li> <li>• Go on a number hunt around your house. Can you find something with the numbers 1-5 on them? Take some pictures of them</li> <li>• Go on an egg hunt around your house/garden. As a grown up to cut out 5 egg shapes and hide them. Hunt around your house to find them and tell your grown up which number you have found each time. Can you put them in the correct order from 1-5?</li> </ul>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you go around your house and find 1 red item, 2 orange items, 3 blue items, 4 green items and 5 white items?</li> </ul>
<b>Knowledge and Understanding</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Thinking about Spring - sharing what we already know and finding out new things</li> <li>Talking about animals on the farm</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Play the 'What am I?' game and see if you can guess the animals by listening to the clues you are given</li> <li>Can you make a rainbow rain cloud? Using some shaving foam, food colouring, a tall glass or plastic container that is see through, follow the instructions using the sheet on Tapestry and make your own</li> <li>Talk about spring and see what you already know then look at the PowerPoint on Tapestry and see if you can learn something new. You could use Lego or cardboard boxes, anything you have on hand</li> <li>• Pretend you are a farmer! Walk around like you are wheeling a wheelbarrow, walk like you are stuck in some mud, climb a ladder, dig with a shovel, pick up hay bails, scatter food for your animals</li> </ul>
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
