
Look at the expressions on the dinosaurs' faces. How were they feeling? Can you jot down 3 words that might describe how they are feeling?

Can you identify the wow words that the author has chosen to make us believe he is a frightening and scary character?




There was even a song about him:

Questions to read and answer.

Read and answer these questions. Write your answers in full sentences.

- 2. Why did the dinosaurs have to leave their nests?
- 3. Why was Baby Brachiosaurus hiding in a cave?
- 4. What plan did Brachiosaurus come up with? What do you think of her idea?

Build a sentence activity – Beware of the Ferociousaurus. On Friday you will describe some fictional dinosaurs which have interesting names. Today you are going to build up some sentences about another dinosaur, the Ferociousaurus.

How do you think it will move? For example: strides; stomps; crashes; trudges; tramples.

What sound do you think it will make? For example: grunts; growls; snarls; hisses; roars.

What do you think it will do? For example: searches for prey; scares other animals.

Using examples from above or some ideas of your own, compose a sentence (or two) that will convince me this dinosaur is as ferocious as its name!
