





Fantasy takes us from one real land to another and constantly carries us on a daring adventure...

Themes in fantasy texts look at:




"The idea of good vs evil"

STORY ELEMENTS

SETTING - Time is usually in this day and age, in a realistic location

PROBLEM - Characters solve a problem using magic

CHARACTERS - They are fictional; however, make sense in the fantasy situation



MYSTICAL POWERS

Some characters have what we call mystical powers. These include characters like Spiderman who can, for example, shoot out spider's webs.




We as an audience know that a normal person cannot do this and so they fit in to the idea of fantasy...


