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Research an inspirational person. Prepare a presentation for the class, about your chosen person. Why do they inspire you? What were their achievements? What were the barriers/obstacles which they had to overcome?	Research the Stone Age! How did they live? What were their houses made from? Can you create a picture or model to show a Stone Age settlement?	Times tables practice! Create a booklet to practice your 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10 and 11 times tables. Use this to help you practice them in future!
What is beyond New Hartley? Research a city in the UK of your choice. Tell us all about it. Why should we visit? What attractions are there? What is it famous for? You could write/type an itinerary of a fun weekend visit to the city of your choice.	Create a poster about a growth minset! How are you going to use a growth mindset to achieve your aspirations in Year 3? How are you going to make yourself and others happier?	Google "Stone Age Fruit Stew". Can you create a tasty sweet stew with your family or carers? Either bring the stew in or show us photos of your masterpiece!
Paint a picture or create a collage to show the skyline at night during the hindu festival of Diwali. Make sure to use bright colours to show the dazzling effect of the fireworks.	Draw/paint a picture of yourself in 20 years time (2039!). What will you look like? What will you have achieved?	Can you use recycled materials at home to create your own Stone Age hammer? Remember, it needs to be sturdy and safe to use.
