For example;


Stegosaurus means 'covered lizard' because it is covered in bony plates along its back.


Torosaurus means 'holey lizard' because it has two big holes in the 'frill' around its neck.


Brachiosaurus means 'arm lizard' because its neck is long and thin like an arm.




