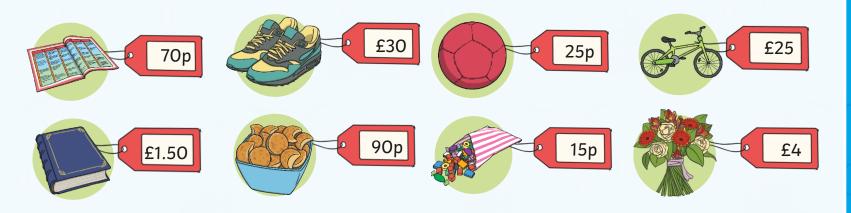

#### Where The Money Goes



Receipt	
Two sandwiches	£2
Two packets of crisps	40p
Two bottles of water	£1
One ball	£1.50

One big cake	£4
Four packets of crisps	<u>80p</u>
One packet of biscuits	80p
One packet of balloons	50p
One packet of party hats	£1

The things we do, such as going to the park, having a birthday party or going on holiday influence what we spend our money on.

#### Where The Money Goes



These children each get £2 pocket money a week. Can they afford what they want? If they can't, what could they do?



#### How Can We Keep Track?



We are going to play a game to work out how we can keep track of what we spend. Look at your card but don't show anyone else what is on it.



We are going to take it in turns to say what we bought and how much it cost. You can use the sentence starter: 'I went shopping and bought..... for ....'.

The next person in the circle must repeat what the previous speaker(s) bought and add their item to that sentence.

They can say: ',....went shopping and bought .... for...., I went shopping and I bought .... for......'.

You need to repeat what everyone who has spoken before you has bought. How far around the circle can we get, remembering what everyone has

It is sometimes difficult to remember what we have spent on each item. So, we need another way to keep track.

#### Ways To Keep Track



In small groups, you are now going to play the shopping game again.



Is it easier to remember what each person bought? Why? Now you can choose a way to record what you bought as a group.
