

Phonics / Reading - We follow the Read Write Inc phonics program. Children will continue to apply Set I and Set 2 Speed Sounds to reading and spelling and learn the remainder of Set 3 Speed Sounds. We will continue to build sight vocabulary of tricky 'red' words too. Please keep an eye out for your child's little Speed Sounds book to keep track of the sounds that have been introduced (these will be highlighted blue) and encourage them to 'teach' you too!



Writing - Writing and spelling sessions will model how to use 'Fred Fingers' to spell phonetically regular words. Children will be taught strategies to help them compose and record simple sentences, using capital letters, spaces and full stops. Some of these writing opportunities could include:

- Retelling of class text Beegu or character description
- Sharing details of favourite books
- Labelling parts of plants
- Instructions How to plant potatoes/seeds
- Cloze activity Ash Wednesday/Lent
- Retelling aspects of the Easter Story
- Recipe instructions Fruit Salad
- Mother's Day poems/letters



Music - Led by Flora, children will learn songs related to sustainability, the seaside, plants and growing and traditional tales.



Using story books, videos and planting potatoes children will begin to understand where food comes from and how to successfully grow potatoes themselves.

Children will learn the basic principles of a healthy and varied diet and work together to safely prepare a delicious fruit salad.

Geography — Seaside Study (carried over from Spring 1) Children will learn the generic features of a seaside and be able to use key vocabulary such as: cliff, rock pool, tide, beach, lighthouse, island, and ocean. We will learn about the impact litter is having on our beaches and sea life as well as ways in which we can protect our beaches.



Science - Plants

Children will learn to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. They will Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees and learn the following key vocabulary: buds, bulbs, deciduous, evergreen, trunk, vegetable, wild plants, environment, blossom, petals, branches

Children will use Chromebooks to access simple, age appropriate phonics and maths games as well as drawing and word processing software via School 360
