In France, Père Noël is said to leave presents in children's shoes.



It is thought that Saint Nicholas was born around AD 300. He had inherited a large sum of money from his parents and used this to help those who were less fortunate. Saint Nicholas is often pictured with a long, white beard and wearing red robes.

One story of Saint Nicholas tells the tale of him generously saving three daughters who were on the verge of being forced into a life of slavery. Over three nights, Saint Nicholas secretly delivered three bags of gold – one for each daughter. However, by the third night, the father of the three girls was so desperate to thank the kind stranger that he stayed awake. Being a shy man and feeling no need for praise, Saint Nicholas delivered the third bag down the chimney so as not to be caught. When the bag reached the bottom of the chimney, it is said to have landed in a pair of stockings which were hanging by the fire.
