English	Writing This week, we will be making links to our overarching theme of Aspirations and taking inspiration from a book called You Are Awesome by Matthew Syed.  Children will be reading about fantastic famous people and their routes to success (including bouncing back from failure). We look at examples of the "mini-fact files" within the text and use iPads to research our own inspirational celebrities and create our own fact files using the model examples in the text.  Our writing process this week is  1. Look at examples of fact file pages from You Are Awesome - Magpie words from the text.  2. Using ICT, can children research their own inspirational famous person and plan what they would include in a fact file about them.  3. Using apostrophes to indicate possession e.g. Usain Bolt's career was very successful.  4. Write a fact file about their chosen inspirational characters.  5. Edit and improve.	<ul> <li>I have uploaded a selection of photographed pages from the book to the Year 3 page on the school website.
