*Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs. These are the special friend sounds such as sh, th ch, ng.

*Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending. *Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words – these are words such as and, I, said, no, of.
