

- Library is Thursday






#### **Our school character virtues**

Over this half term, we will be learning about different celebrations. We will learn how different people and different parts of the world believe and celebrate in different things.

We will celebrate our uniqueness.

We will listen carefully to different stories, talking about what we have heard and expressing our own thoughts and opinions.

We will continue to develop our friendships. We will work on understanding the importance of sharing and taking turns to make things fair and how this can affect our feelings in positive and negative ways. We will talk about keeping healthy.


Our <u>Fine motor development</u> is a key area we need to work on this half term. So we will be introduced to a new intervention programme called Pegs to paper, where we will be building muscle strength in our fingers and further developing our pencil grip. We will continue Dough Disco and squiggle and trying to write on a large scale frequently.


We will continue to enjoy PE.

#### Specific Areas – Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding of the World, Expressive Arts and Design

We will have phonics lessons daily. Our phonic lessons will concentrate on recapping previous taught sounds and introducing new set 1 sounds. We will also be working on blending and segmenting words. Ideally, we would like <u>all children to be blending words independently by Christmas.</u>

Every day we will be working on recognising and writing our names. We will continue to enjoy Drawing club, reading our story vote books and retelling our favourite stories. We will encourage the children to mark make and give meanings to their marks, hopefully using some letters to represent words.

In Maths, we will continue to work hard on numbers 0-5, looking at subitising and composition. We will be naming and using 2D shapes and working on positional language.

In Understanding of the World we will be developing our knowledge of a variety of festivals of light including bonfire night, Diwali and Hannukah, we will use BBC Let's Celebrate to support our learning.

We will enjoy charanga music sessions where we build up our knowledge of beats and rhythm as well as learning Christmas songs for our Christmas song performance at the Memorial Hall.

We will make cards and calendars using a variety of art skills.
