Sustainability – What can you do to help our planet?



This newsletter is intended to give you an overview of important dates and key information about the learning opportunities your children will be involved in over the coming weeks. We hope you find it useful.

Notices:

PE Days – Monday and Tuesday. Please come to school in PE kit of house coloured t-shirt (no football shirts), plain black or blue shorts/tracksuit bottoms and trainers.

Water Bottles – Water bottles are provided by school. They are kept in the classroom and filled with fresh water every morning.

English: **Phonics & Reading**

Children are grouped according to their next steps. They will continue to learn new Speed Sounds, and revise known Speed Sounds, and how to apply these to reading and spelling. We will continue to build sight vocabulary of tricky 'red' words too. We will also develop reading skills, including comprehension and fluency, through our RWI reading sessions. Every

English: **Writing**

We will continue to place emphasis on the importance of high quality and accurate writing. We will read several texts linked to different topics which we will use as inspiration when writing for different purposes and genres. We will look at the imaginative picture book Tuesday, by David Wiesner. We will use the detailed illustrations and our own inferences and creative ideas to write setting descriptions and to continue the story. Making links to our geography topic of 'Hot and Cold Places', we will write postcards and letters from places around the world. We will make links to our whole-school core theme of sustainability by exploring the thought-provoking picture book 'My Friend the Earth' and using this as a stimulus to write our own poems about caring for the environment.

afternoon, we will enjoy sharing a book as a whole class.

We read stories every day from a range of picture books, often linked to our theme. Some of the stories we will focus on this half term include:



Maths: Money - We will be moving on to learning about money, including using knowledge from place value and addition and subtraction to find the total value of a set of coins. We will count money in pounds and pence and choose notes and coins to make a given amount. We will compare amounts of money, count change and solve two-step problems, thinking the context of the question. **Multiplication and Division** - We will use our knowledge of equal groups, and odd and even numbers, to group, share, double and half numbers. We will learn about the symbols and vocabulary for multiplication and division. We will also learn the 2x table, 5x table and 10x table.

Science: Animals, including Humans
We will notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults. We will also find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air). We will learn how to describe the importance of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

Computing: Making music
Using Holst's 'The Planets Suite', we will listen to and appraise music commenting on how it makes us feel. We will use words to describe music as we compare different pieces of music. We will use Chrome Music Lab on School 360 to experiment with playing and making music. We will experiment with pitch, duration, volume, tempo and choice of musical instrument.

Art: Painting and mixed media: Life in colour
We will learn the names of the primary and secondary colours and talk about what happens when two colours mix together. Using paint, we will learn how to create different textures and patterns. We will compose a collage, choosing and arranging materials for effect. Finally, we will evaluate our artwork and think about improvements that could be made.

Music: Charanga – 'I wanna play in a band'
Based on the song 'I wanna play in a band', we will listen to and & appraise different styles of music and continue to embed the interrelated dimensions of music through games, singing and playing. We will also use the glockenspiels to read notes and improvise when playing along.

Geography: Hot and Cold Places
Using our map reading skills, we will name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans. We will identify the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Pole. We will also compare temperatures between the Poles and the Equator, and around the world.

PE: Gymnastics / Modified Team Games
On our PE days, we will use the floor and apparatus to explore how to travel around the space in different ways. We will think about how we can use shape, actions and travelling movements within a sequence.

PSHCE: Virtues - Cleanliness, Fairness and Friendliness

In this topic, we will learn about what a parable is. We will explore the parable of the Lost Son and think about what it tells
